S.A. preps for population boom

San Antonio.- City officials announced on Wednesday plans to prepare San Antonio for an expected population boom in the next 25 years.

"SA Tomorrow," a three-part collaborative program between residents, businesses and officials hopes encourages sustainable and positive growth throughout the city.

Officials project that 1 million people will move to San Antonio by 2040, which will require the city to create additional transportation modes, new jobs, and housing options.

Mayor Ivy Taylor stressed the importance of citizen participation in the planning process.

"Citizen involvement in the planning process will mean the difference between a set of plans that sits on a shelf, or planning documents that are living, breathing, reflections of how our residents feel about the future of our city," Mayor Taylor said.

Officials hope that transportation resources like VIA Metropolitan Transit's new E-bus will help manage downtown traffic. The bus plans to run during evenings from
