About SA Tomorrow

WHO

SA Tomorrow is led by the City of San Antonio and includes the City, partner agencies, and San Antonio residents.

WHAT

A three-pronged planning effort to guide the city toward smart, sustainable growth. The three plans include: the Comprehensive Plan, the Sustainability Plan, and the Multimodal Transportation Plan.

WHERE

SA Tomorrow covers all of San Antonio.

WHEN

SA Tomorrow formally kicks off with a public event on Saturday, April 11, 2015, and the planning process will continue through April 2016.

WHY

San Antonio is expected to grow by more than 1,000,000 people by 2040, effectively doubling the population of the city.

HOW

The city-wide plan will set goals for San Antonio to reach by the year 2040.

SA TOMORROW: A VIBRANT NEW PLANNING EFFORT FOR SAN ANTONIO

SA Tomorrow is a three-pronged planning effort to guide the city towards smart sustainable growth through a Comprehensive Plan, a Sustainability Plan, and a Multimodal Transportation Plan. These three plans will provide guidance on how the city will develop over the next 25 years to accommodate 1.1 million additional people who will be living, raising a family, and working within the city.



The Comprehensive Plan will address land use, urban design and municipal policy to coordinate various City resources and incentive programs to accommodate projected growth and provide more choices for future and current residents.



A plan for all modes of transportation, including cars, transit, bicycles, and pedestrians. The transportation plan will communicate the City's transportation strategy and will serve as a tool to analyze transportation priorities to best meet community goals.



A plan grounded in the three pillars of sustainability- social, economic, and environmental. The sustainability plan will include metrics of success that will be tracked and reported.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Who is leading the SA Tomorrow planning efforts for the City of San Antonio?

Mayor Ivy Taylor and Councilman Nirenberg are leading this effort on behalf of city leadership with support from city staff, specifically, John Dugan, Director of Planning and Community Development; Doug Melnick, Chief Sustainability Officer; and Terry Bellamy, Assistant Director of Transportation & Capital Improvements.

What are San Antonio's current statistics?

The United States Census Bureau provides the following information:

Population (2013 estimate)	1,409,019 people
Travel time to work (mean, workers age 16+)	23.3 minutes
Housing (2010)	524,246 units
Businesses (2007)	109,195 firms
Land area (2010)	460.93 square miles
Persons per square mile (2010)	2,879.8 people/square mile

When will San Antonio residents have the opportunity to be involved in these plans?

San Antonio residents will have essential and important involvement in SA Tomorrow. The planning process will bring together neighbors, institutional stakeholders, technical experts, City staff, and outside consultants. There will be working groups, study sessions, stakeholder interviews, community workshops, and public meetings. Opportunities for input are available through the SA Tomorrow website and social media, and an outreach program focused on traditional media.

Will SA Tomorrow have an impact on public policy?

Yes. SA Tomorrow will guide City of San Antonio leaders as they set public policy that preserves social, economic, and environmental resources; develops transit corridors that consider current and future congestion; and unites planning efforts to make sure public policies and procedures are interconnected, complementary, and work together.
